COMPETITION COACH

THE ROLE

We match every team with a Competition Coach who can give real-life advice and insights. Competition Coaches are Investment professionals who volunteer their time to help the teams through the competition. Coaches provide advice, insights and real links to the industry.



SUPPORT AND ADVICE

Support includes advice on useful sources of information, explanations of key investment terms, concepts, and methods, as well as guidance on how to build a strong argument and deliver an effective presentation. Students can also receive feedback on their Company Analysis drafts and Elevator Pitch to help them refine and improve their work.

COMMON SCENARIOS MAY INCLUDE:

- The team may ask for your help in reviewing sources to check their credibility, or to explain certain terms or phrases they've come across during their research.
- They might also ask you to look over their Company Analysis and provide feedback.
- In addition, they may be curious about your career journey and how you got into the industry.



ABOUT YOU

Coaches can be from any sector of the investment management industry, and be of any gender or age. Good communication skills help, but the main attributes coaches need are enthusiasm, an open mind, and sometimes, perseverance!

COMPETITION COACH

THE ROLE

Coaches meet with their teams approximately once every two weeks, either online, by phone, or in person, to guide them in their research, support their company analysis, and help them develop the strongest pitch possible.

COMMITMENT



Coach commitment varies, but a guide is:

- 4 x 20-30 min lunchtime online meetings over the 10 weeks (excluding October break)
- 1-2 emails each week to answer queries or point teams in the right direction (this may increase closer to the deadline)
- Feeding back on the team's Analysis and Video

NOT ALL TEAMS WILL COMPLETE

Some teams will drop out before submitting their report entry. Students face many pressures and may step back from the competition due to other commitments.



SAFEGUARDING

For safeguarding purposes, all communication with students must include the designated Teacher Champion. To ensure best practice, please include the Teacher Champion in all forms of communication, whether it's online, in person, or via email.

TOP TIPS FROM A TEACHER

Here are some helpful tips from our Teacher Champions on best practices for effective coaching.



QUIETNESS DOESN'T MEAN DISINTEREST

Communicating with teens can be challenging. They're often quiet at first and may be hesitant to ask questions for fear of sounding "silly." It's also important to remember that students face a range of pressures, and some may drop out of the competition. **This is not a reflection on you or your support.**



WRITTEN FEEDBACK IS HELPFUL

Students benefit from clear explanations and written examples or notes. Students often struggle to remember verbal feedback, so providing something in writing after a meeting can be really helpful.



SHARED DOCUMENTS

Using shared documents allows everyone to view and comment in one place. Most schools use Google Drive or similar platforms to share files, which makes it easier for both you and the team to collaborate, give feedback, and stay on track.



COULD YOU HOST AN OFFICE VISIT?

Students prefer meeting in person and really enjoy attending meetings outside of school. Future Asset may be able to help with travel expenses.

COMPETITION

FIRST MEETING

The first meeting can feel a bit daunting for both teams and coaches. To help you get started, we've pulled together some useful questions and considerations based on insights from schools, teachers, and coaches over the years.

Getting to know the team

- 1. What are you hoping to get out of this experience?
- 2. Have you ever learned about investing or finance before?

Understanding Roles and Strengths

1. What skills do you feel you bring to the team (e.g., research, presenting, organising)?

Setting Expectations

- 1. How do you want to communicate as a group (email, shared doc)?
- 2. Are there any challenges you're worried about, like deadlines or confidence in certain areas?

Project Focus

- 1. Have you thought about any companies or sectors you're interested in researching?
- 2. Is there anything you'd like me to explain or support you with early on?

THINGS TO CONSIDER

- **Build Rapport** Take some time to introduce yourself and encourage the team to introduce themselves.
- **Acknowledge nerves** Reassure the team that there are no "silly questions" and that you're here to support, not judge.
- **Set short-term goals** Help them set realistic goals and agree on a rough timeline for the next meeting or check-in.
